## Autumn Term 2021 News

### Emergency Response Area

You may have heard on the local news that from 1<sup>st</sup> November, Cambridgeshire and Peterborough became an 'Enhanced Response Area' (ERA). ERA status will mean more resources from government for additional measures to drive down recent rises in COVID-19 infection and to protect vulnerable people, the NHS and other vital services as the winter months approach. The aim is to bring down infection rates which are currently higher in most areas than seen in January's peak.

With this in mind, we would like to let you know about current measures in school; we are working as 3 'bubbles' at school (Picasso, Kandinsky and a combined Monet and Van Gogh 'bubble'). This is enabling us to minimise contact between children. Our Collective Worship continues to be via Zoom and we are limiting the number of visitors to school as essential visitors only. Adults in school are also wearing face coverings at all times when they are outside of their classroom environment e.g. in corridors and the staffroom. We are really hoping that these measures will support us in keeping our school open and as many children and adults attending every day! Your support with reminding your children/child about coughs and sneezes would be appreciated (see image) as we have lots of the usual autumn term sniffles at the moment! We would also encourage you to wear a face covering whilst on our school site and to avoid gathering in large groups – your support, as always, is appreciated!

## Home Learning

Thank you to all parents who shared their views about home learning last half term. From this week, we will set whole school home learning via our STARz online learning platform. The home learning will be set every Tuesday to be completed by the following Monday. This week's is available now although we know it only gives the weekend to complete.

Due to feedback, this home learning is **not** compulsory. We had mixed feedback with some families not wishing to engage at the moment for a variety of reasons through to families who expressed a desire to set a home learning expectation each week for their child/children particularly in relation to being prepared for secondary school. We hope that by giving parents a choice we can meet the needs of most; this includes those who may want to engage on some weeks but are not able to on others.

Attached with this newsletter is a 'How to' guide which explains how to log on, how to find the home learning page and how to submit learning. All children in Picasso and Kandinsky have been shown how to do this for themselves but Monet and Van Gogh will require some support.

Please can we take this opportunity to remind parents about the value of reading at home even if you are not engaging in the online home learning; any time spent engaging with books whether it is being read to, listening to e-stories or reading to someone is valuable.

## Value for this half term: Generosity

In school Collective Worship the children will reflect on what it means to be generous and learn about what this means for Christians. We will think about being generous beyond the giving and sharing of 'things' to reflect on how we can be generous with our kindness, our love, our time, our forgiveness and so on.
