
Live author events

Safer Internet Day



Next Tuesday (9th February) is Safer Internet Day and your children will have some activities to do to support them to learn and reflect on internet safety in an age appropriate way. There is a resource linked to Safer Internet Day aimed at parents and carers which can be accessed here if you would like to find out more.

There are several Live Lessons aimed at primary aged children next Tuesday (9th February) too. The first is being delivered via YouTube by Barefoot Computing who are well established and well known. However, because it is live (at 1:30pm) we wanted to share the link with parents rather than with children so that you can make a decision about whether this is appropriate for your child and supervise appropriately. It can be accessed here or you can use the same link after the live event to watch in your own time.

The BBC will also broadcast a 30-minute Live Lesson in partnership with the UK Safer Internet Centre, aimed at primaryaged children which is linked to the primary computing curriculum. In the session, children will learn about how we can stay safe, responsible and wise in an increasingly digital world, with tips and advice from some of the biggest personalities on the web. The lesson can be accessed here and will also be on the CBBC channel on the morning of 9th February 2021 at



11am. There is a worksheet which goes alongside the live lesson which we have attached with this newsletter. If your child/ren have a go at this please upload to STARZ for teachers to see.
