#### End of half term

Today we eagerly await the announcement of when children will return to school and we pray that this will be the 8<sup>th</sup> March for all children. If there is a need to change any of our systems or routines once our Risk Assessment has been updated in light of any new guidance, we will let you know as soon as we can.

#### **New Reading Books**

In the last newsletter, we let you know that we have been busy asking the children to choose their preferred books from a selection of recommended reading books for their age. These have all now arrived and have been stamped and collated. We would love it if you were able to come to school to collect the books for your child so that they can begin to enjoy them.

The books will be organised into families so that you only need to make one visit to school if you have more than one child. Collection can be made between 9:15am and 2:45pm this week on the following days:

- Wednesday if your surname starts with the letter A to F
- Thursday if your surname starts with the letter G to M
- Friday if your surname starts with the letter N to W

Each child <u>not in school</u> has two school books to borrow – Year 1 and 2 have been chosen by Mrs MacLeod and children in Years 3 to 6 have at least one of the books that they chose and the other has been chosen by their teacher.

They will be placed outside the main entrance in a covered trug in case it rains and we sincerely hope that the children will love these new books!!

We will continue to make reading books available to Van Gogh class too – please message Mrs Wilcock through your child's STARZ page to request more when needed!

You may recall that we informed parents before Christmas that we have been working closely with Daisies Montessori Nursery to build a brand new purpose built nursery on our school grounds. At the time, we let you know that we had received approval from the Diocese and

the local PCC to move to the planning application stage and this application has now been submitted to Huntingdonshire District Council.
