#### Picasso and Kandinsky Faith Tour

The Faith tour for Kandinsky and Picasso takes place on 29<sup>th</sup> November. Given that we will visit 3 different places of worship, it is important that we all respect the religious and cultural traditions of these places of worship. Therefore, please could we ask that all children:

- Dress in school uniform which includes clothing to cover legs e.g. long trousers, tights worn with dresses/skirts
- Wear suitable coverings on their feet e.g. socks or tights as they will be asked to remove their footwear before entering the Mosque and Gurdwara
- Bring a packed lunch that is strictly vegetarian with no meat, fish or eggs
- Bring something suitable as a headscarf to cover their head e.g. a scarf. This should not be a hat. Headscarves must be worn by everyone who enters the Gurdwara (there are spares at the entrance for those who forget). Females also need to wear a headscarf in the Mosque.

This multi-faith day is a wonderful experience for the children and we are delighted to be joined by Rev'd Mandy for the day.
