Routines in Monet Class

Please bring in your **book bag** and **diary** everyday for messages. Please bring in your **reading books** when they are ready to change.

Water bottles, hats and wellies - to be kept in school

Please send your child to school with a **waterproof coat** everyday as we will be out in all weathers.

Bags – to maximise space in the cloakroom and minimise items being brought into school, pupils will only require a book bag and **not** a rucksack.

Please send in a small **change of clothes** that can be kept on your child's peg in a named plastic bag. This will prevent the borrowing of clothes following an accident.

Year 1 and 2 Home Learning Expectations

We are currently seeking the views of parents about home learning but whilst we await the outcome of this, please do read every day for at least 15 – 20mins. This can involve sharing a book, discussing a story or an adult reading to the child.

Home learning tasks:

- Practise mathematical facts making use of <u>Mathletics</u>.
- Year 2 can also use <u>Times Tables Rockstars</u>. Log in details can be found in the back of the children's reading diaries.
- Phonics (see next page)
- High frequency (or tricky) words for both reading and spelling

Reading

Children need to *learn to read* before they can *read to learn*In order to support your child in learning to read we have completed a detailed diagnostic assessment on every pupil to accurately understand their reading level. We are therefore able to provide them with the structured scheme book to ensure the optimum 5-10% challenge i.e. they can accurately read all 90-95% of the words. This allows pupils to effectively take on board new reading techniques, words and phrases to retain in their long term memory. Reading sessions will be on a Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Children can change their books any week day but each book should be read 3 times before being returned to school.

First read – to decode and apply phonic knowledge and pick up technical vocabulary with prompts from adults.

Second read — to apply their reading knowledge independently.

Third read – as a fluent story teller attacking whole words and sentences with fluency and pace (rather than breaking down words sound by sound.)

Equally, pupils need to hear quality literature from renowned authors that they select according to their personal interest. These books will usually be above your child's reading level but it is important to impart rich vocabulary, descriptive language and phrasing. This is the perfect opportunity for you to share reading and model intonation and expression in line with punctuation.

Celebrating Achievements

Within Monet Class we have a **Proud Cloud** and a **Rainbow**. This is a place where all children can be recognised for their outstanding effort and achievements, as well as their personal growth in terms of manners, kindness and caring to others.

This can be a verbal award or written in books during marking.

Tokens will be awarded for end of term treats and **certificates** from the headteacher and for leading learners will be awarded in celebration assemblies, alongside other certificates and stickers for specific events.

In school Year 1 and 2 must have

Outdoor shoes for the field when wet e.g. wellington boots or old trainers

Appropriate outdoor clothing – waterproof/warm coat - sunhat in the hot weather

A water bottle to be kept in school all week.

PE Kit – trainers, t-shirt and shorts. Joggers and hoodies weather according.

Children should not bring in equipment from home e.g. No rucksacks, pencil cases or toys.

PE in Year 1 and 2

Wednesday - Games with external specialist coach.

Monday - Dance

Please can children be ready for PE with the correct kit for full participation.

- Long hair should be tied back.
- No jewellery Necklaces, friendship bracelets etc.
- Earrings should be removed completely and only covered with tape in exceptional circumstances.

Children should currently be wearing a white t-shirt, black shorts and suitable shoes for indoor/outdoor sport. In cold weather they may also need plain black jogging bottoms and hoodies.

Current Collection Arrangements

We will bring the class out to you on the bottom 'D' of the playground. Pupils will be encouraged to wave to parents/carers and they will be sent to them once adults have responded with a wave. Please can we be afforded time to dismiss all pupils before entering into specific conversations or messages. If you feel you need a private or more detailed conversation then please telephone or email the office.

It is vital that we are informed by parents of any changes to collection before we are able to release children to other adults. This includes at the end of the school day, bus arrangements and after school clubs. We have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know your children over the last couple of weeks and we are looking forward to a great year ahead!
