Reading Workshop - Year 1 and 2 parents -18th September

Please join us for our Year 1 and 2 reading workshop on Wednesday 18th September at 2.30pm. The workshop will be focusing on gaining the most from structured reading books. We will examine and share a range of strategies that children can apply in different combinations. Following on from this we will look at the breadth of assessment criteria in becoming an effective reader and how best you can help your child with comprehension, both literal and inferential.

Phonics Workshop – Thursday 26th September

This workshop is for parents of our Foundation children and any Monet parents who would like a refresher! Mrs Wilcock will share the resource that we use for teaching phonics, 'Storytime Phonics' and she will go over what we teach in each phase. She will also share the ways in which you can support your child at home with this important skill in learning read.

New Term Reminders

The next section is a list of reminders which we hope you will find helpful.

School uniform – it was lovely to see everyone looking so neat and tidy on their first day back. Please ensure that your child has the correct uniform at all times including shoes. I know this can sometimes be a problem as the shops can run out of stock during the holidays but please ensure that we are made aware of any delay so that we don't keep asking your child about their footwear which can be embarrassing for them. There is a clear guide on the school website of what is expected.

Hair- all shoulder length hair and longer should be tied up at all times not just in PE. This is part of our Health and Safety risk assessment to ensure that everyone is kept safe. Hair adornments should be kept to a minimum and should be in school colours only.

Earrings – If your child has pierced ears they need to remove their earrings for PE lessons. If they cannot remove them then please provide some micro pore tape that they can apply to cover them during the lesson. This is required for health and safety reasons. The school no longer provides tape for this purpose.

Lost Property – please label all of your children's clothes including shoes. It is extremely time consuming for staff and costly for you when items go missing! The name stickers seem to be very good (and the most time efficient).

Sickness absence –If your child is unwell then please telephone the school office before 9.30am so we can ensure that they are marked on the register correctly.

Arriving late at school - Please can we remind you that our school day starts at 8.50am. If you arrive after this time then please bring your child into school via the main office. We need to know they have arrived on site as they may not have been marked into the register in the classroom. Lateness can be upsetting for a child particularly if their class mates have already settled to learning. They will be marked late on the registers if they arrive after 8.50am and they will be marked absent for the morning session if they arrive after registers close at 9am.

Car Park – Please ensure that you park sensibly in the car park. Due to the nature of the car park flooring we cannot paint lines to section spaces but please do consider other users by ensuring that you pull forward against the edges, that gaps between cars are not too big and that you are parked straight!!! Please do not park on the main road at any time. This area is for the bus and emergency vehicles only.

Collection at the end of the day – Your child can be collected, with your permission, by anyone listed on your contact sheet. If someone else is taking them home then please contact the school

office by 2.30pm to give your permission for us to release them at the end of the day. If your child is in Year 5 or 6 and you would like them to walk home without an adult, please come into the school office to sign a permission slip.

Bus users- If your child has a bus pass we assume that they will use the transport every day. If they have a regular pattern of being collected on other days then please let the office know.

Dogs on site

We do kindly ask that dogs are not brought onto the school site and if they are tied up outside please ensure that this is not too close to our gates as some children can be frightened by dogs.

Email communication – Information is sent home via email by an **outgoing email account only**. If you wish to contact the office please email to <u>Office@abbotsripton.cambs.sch.uk</u>

Monies into the office – Please send in dinner money promptly as if you have a debt on your account of more than £10 we will ask that you provide a packed lunch until this payment is cleared. All money should be sent into the school office in a named envelope stating who and what the money is for. Please ensure that cheques are paid to the correct place e.g. school or clubs providers. If sending in cash, the correct change is always appreciated! Cheques made payable to Abbots Ripton CE Primary School.

Packed lunches - We encourage all children to eat healthily and whilst we appreciate a small treat is nice to have in their lunch box, please do try to send your child with a balanced meal and we ask that this does not include any sweets or fizzy drinks.

Water bottles - Please ensure you send in a named water bottle every day with your child. Please do not fill bottles with anything but water to consume in the classroom.
