Well I'm writing again from 'lockdown' which we know is challenging for everyone but we also know that there is a need to keep everyone safe and to support the effort to reduce contacts. I was delighted that we were able to start our remote learning offer so quickly and that even on the first day of term, despite the very short notice of closure, we had children logging in and completing learning.

It is important to acknowledge once again, that we do understand that all family circumstances are different and we know that parents are doing their very best. There are some external expectations on schools to be providing at least 4 hours of learning each day for children in primary school during lockdown, but we also know that for some families this is not realistic. Children at home are accessing learning which is in line with those who are in school as critical worker children or those classed as vulnerable, so we know that learning can take 4 hours. This is in no way intended to add pressure to parents; please do as much with your child/children as you are able and try to also enjoy some family time together which is separate and distinct from school learning as we know that the children will appreciate this.

Zoom contact with children



During the last lockdown, we found the face to face contact between teachers and children, as well as children and their peers, very useful in ensuring that children felt connected with school. We will therefore be sending Zoom links to parents for the calls next week. These will be sent on Monday and we would just like to remind parents about some ground rules, some of which we appreciate you sharing with your children:

- It must just be the child who is on the screen for others to see and no one else.
- Your child must be supervised by you, in the same room, for the duration of the zoom meeting.
- Your child must be dressed appropriately imagine you are coming to school on a non-uniform day.
- Please do not screen shot the meeting in any way these would be images in people's homes and would not be appropriate to share with others.
- Please discuss expectations about conduct with your child they should conduct themselves in the same way that they do in school. They will each be given a turn to share something that they have been doing and must listen to others when it is isn't their turn.

Of course, if you would prefer not to take part or you are unable to join the meeting for some reason, please do not worry.

Reminder about wet weather clothing for children in school

We will be going out to play in all weathers, even if it is very wet, so please can you ensure that your child always has a coat, preferably with a hood and a pair of wellington boots in school.

2020 has been a difficult year for us all, but even more so for the children and young people who go in to 2021 without a stable home and loving family. This New Year we are looking for people who are determined, energetic and caring, to become foster carers.

Fostering with Cambridgeshire County or Peterborough City Councils means you are fostering with a local authority that truly cares about you and our children. We offer comprehensive training courses both before and during your fostering adventure with us. We also allocate a

social worker who will support you and we also provide a 24/7 helpline so you will never feel alone!

Remember if you are a Cambridgeshire County Council or Peterborough City Council employee and undergoing an assessment as a foster carer for either council, (with agreement from your line manager), you are entitled to additional annual leave of up to 5 days to attend training courses.

NHS message



The NHS has asked for this message to be shared with all parents. Undiagnosed Type 1 diabetes in children requires urgent medical attention.

If your child has ANY of the main symptoms of Type 1 diabetes please make an urgent GP appointment or contact the Out of Hours service. The main symptoms are known as the 4 Ts – Thirst, Toilet, Tiredness, Thinner. If you notice your child is thirsty or using the toilet more frequently, is always feeling tired, or has lost weight recently, seek immediate medical advice.

NHS services are very well equipped to look after children safely if they are unwell. Please do not delay seeking medical advice because of Covid-19.
