Therefore we will be offering this but need to make a final decision on the format in order that we can best meet the needs of our families based on your responses.

Uniform, PE kits and After School Clubs

At the start of term we asked that children come to school on their PE days dressed in their PE kits. Having reviewed this with staff, we would like to continue to ask that children come in PE kit for their PE day/s:

This kit should be appropriate for the weather i.e. shorts if warm and tracksuit if cooler.

Lastly, it is really helpful for all children to have a pair of old trainers or wellington boots to leave at school to change into when the field gets muddier; having this change of shoes enables children to enjoy the whole of our outdoor space without ruining their school shoes and our carpets!
