Oliver C – (Yr1) - For some great descriptive writing about his character and his creative ideas for his chosen world and comic. Super effort Oliver!


Summer holiday learning



Many thanks again to those of you who responded to our survey about home learning in the summer holidays. The vast majority of parents responded to say that they didn't require any learning but some did ask for further support or guidance. We didn't know at the time of surveying parents, but the Local Authority have been busy putting together, 'Moving on up' packs. These are brilliant! There is an English and a Maths pack for children 'moving on up' to each year group. They aim to consolidate the key learning from this year with the idea that children will be better prepared for 'moving up'.

We have decided to share these will all parents by email and will print them for parents who requested a pack through the survey. These will be sent home with children who are in school and will be available to collect from school if your child isn't in school. We will email the parents that this applies to. Teachers have adjusted the packs for some children with the hope that they will meet the needs of a greater range of abilities. We hope you find them useful.

Also, reading is a great thing to be doing little and often through the Summer. Oxford Owl has a great website for parents as it has a huge free eBook library (it is only free due to the lockdown so make the most of it!). As well recognisable characters such as Biff, Chip and Kipper and Winnie the Witch, you'll also find some great non-fiction eBooks to help your child explore the world. Books can be searched by age or by colour band if you know what colour band your child was reading at school.
