With this newsletter we have shared a letter regarding applying for Free School Meals. We have had confirmation that eligible families will receive a voucher for £90 per child



to support with food shopping during the Summer holidays. If you are eligible to apply, please do (see the attached letter and information below) as there is still time for you to apply and become eligible to receive the supermarket voucher this summer. To find out if you are eligible please fill out the simple online application form at

www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals where you will receive an instant response as to your eligibility status. If you are eligible we will be informed within 3 days and can then apply for the vouchers on your behalf.

Families who are already in receipt of Free School Meals do not need to reapply and your vouchers will be emailed to you as soon as I receive them; hopefully before the end of term!
