Welcome back to another new school year! We hope you all had a lovely summer break and are now ready for what will be an exciting and busy Autumn term.

We would like to warmly welcome our new teacher Mrs Whales who joins Miss Slater in Kandinsky class. I know that she is very excited about joining us!

Class information meetings

You will see from the diary dates that each class teacher will be running an informal meeting for parents over the next couple of weeks. The aim of this meeting is to give parents an opportunity to meet teachers. Teachers will also set out their expectations, explain key routines such as home learning and go over some of the ways in which you can support learning at home. You will also have the opportunity to ask questions. We look forward to seeing you there.



Curriculum Maps

Every half term each class teacher writes and sends home a Curriculum Map which gives you an overview of what your child is learning during the half term. This half term's map will be given out at the Class Information meetings (please see diary dates).

Accelerated Reader

We have made the decision not to continue with the Accelerated Reader program this year. We have reviewed how we have been using this over the last academic year and do not feel that it is value for money at almost £1800. How we teach reading and how we develop reading for pleasure is a key priority on our development plan for this year and we feel that this money would be better spent on new reading books.



Collective Worship Values

The Values which we focus on during our Collective Worship are an important part of sustaining and developing our school's Christian ethos. Children are able to explain why these values and learning about how to live our lives following these values, is important.

Each half term, we will focus on a different value. Our Value for this half term is Faithfulness.

Collecting children at the end of the school day

In order to encourage independence, we will continue to allow our KS2 (Year 3-6) children to leave their classroom at the end of the school day without their teacher. They will be responsible for finding the person who is collecting them and they will be expected to go to the teacher on the playground if the person who is collecting them is not there. Children will know that they should NOT leave the school grounds without an adult. If your child is in Year 5 or 6 and you would like them to be allowed to leave the site unaccompanied i.e. they are allowed to walk home from school, please do let the office know so that you can sign the permission form.



We would also like to remind parents that they should wait for their child in the last 2 thirds of the playground so it is easier for staff to make sure the children get to the correct adult.

Can we also remind you that the school grounds must be vacated by **3.30pm at the latest** and that the field and playground equipment is not to be used at the end of the day.

Can you help?

Firstly, Mrs Wilcock has asked whether anyone has any of the following items that they would be happy to donate for her classroom:

- a globe - one on a stand if possible
- toy cars, especially emergency vehicles
- a toy baby buggy.

Also do you own a trailer or van? We have lots of items that need taking to the tip which are too large for a staff car. If you can help please let the office know by next Friday so we can get this organised.

Pupil details

It is important for the safety of your child/children that we have up to date contact details as well as medical information, held in school. We will be sending home your child's 'Data Collection' form which has the current information that we hold. We would like all parents to check, amend and return these by Friday 14th September. Even if there are no amendments to be made, we still need all parents to return the signed form.

Dinner Money

The cost of a school meal each day has increased by 5p to £2.40. We feel that the hot meal provided by Jo is great value as she continues to cook on site with fresh ingredients each day. There is also a selection of fruit and vegetables each day in addition to the set meal. The Government are still acknowledging the huge benefits of having a hot meal at school and are therefore still funding the free school meals for KS1. If your child is in Foundation, Year 1 or 2 there is therefore no charge for their meal.

If your child is having a school meal and they are in KS2 (Years 3-6) the cost of meals this half term will be £76.80 (32 days @ £2.40). If you wish to pay weekly the cost is £12.00.



Please forward payment to the school office in a **sealed and named envelope**. Cheques made payable to Abbots Ripton CE Primary School. We continue to look into direct payments for dinner money but currently this is not available due to running costs of the systems required.

A polite reminder that meals **must be paid for in advance** as we do not have the cash flow to manage debts in school.



Cool Milk registration

Don't forget to register if you wish your child to receive milk each day (with the exception of the Foundation children as this has already been done.)
