



## **COVID Outbreak Contingency Plan- September 2021**

Should my child self-isolate or miss school?	<ul> <li>All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.</li> <li>From 16<sup>th</sup> August 2021, children under 18 (or double vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate if a member of their household or a contact has COVID.</li> <li>NO</li> <li>Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.</li> </ul>
<b>Ċŧţ</b>	<ul> <li>If your child develops COVID symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PCR test, <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow Test.</li> <li>If your child develops COVID symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.</li> <li>If your child tests positive for COVID, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated- but instead should book a PCR test.</li> </ul>

Community COVID Risk	Description	Action
Low Community Transmission. No School Cases.	<ul> <li>There have been no cases of COVID within school for 10 school days.</li> <li>Cases of COVID locally are low and/or stable.</li> <li>Hospitalisations/Deaths due to COVID nationally are low.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>NO COVID measures are necessary beyond:</li> <li>Regular handwashing/sanitising including when children arrive in school, after break, before and after lunch and after PE lessons.</li> <li>Reminding children of good respiratory hygiene – catch it bin it kill it.</li> <li>Ensuring good ventilation across the school.</li> <li>VG and M eating in class groups in the hall and K and P eating in their classrooms.</li> <li>Ensuring children/staff to stay at home if they have COVID symptoms (and to book a PCR test)</li> <li>Collective worship in classrooms</li> <li>Staff will continue to test themselves using Lateral Flow Tests until the end of September.</li> </ul>
Rapidly Rising Community Transmission	<ul> <li>No current COVID cases have been recorded at school, but</li> <li>Cases of COVID are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools.</li> <li>Cambridgeshire Public Health/Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/national infection wave.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Ventilation of classrooms increased.</li> <li>Large indoor public performance audience numbers reduced.</li> <li>Staff room capacity is reduced to 4.</li> <li>Whole school collective worship is delivered virtually.</li> <li>Staff given the option to wear face coverings if moving between classes, in the corridors and when talking with parents.</li> </ul>



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Number of Cases	Description	Actions
A single child tests positive	<ul> <li>A single child tests positive for COVID in a class.</li> <li>There are fewer than 5 cases in the class group.</li> <li>No other classes are affected.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it.</li> <li>The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts.</li> <li>Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track &amp; Trace and advised to book PCR Test. The school will contact parents to advise this if close contacts are known.</li> <li>Children do not need to miss school or self-isolate whilst they wait for the result of the PCR test unless they have COVID symptoms.</li> </ul>
A single staff member tests positive	<ul> <li>A single adult tests positive for COVID in a class.</li> <li>There are fewer than 5 cases in the class group.</li> <li>No other classes are affected.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The staff member self-isolates for 10 days. They will be expected to work from home if they are well enough.</li> <li>The staff member will be contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts.</li> <li>Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track &amp; Trace and advised to book PCR Test. The school will also advise this if close contacts are known, particularly other colleagues.</li> <li>Staff do not need to miss school or self- isolate whilst they wait for the result of the PCR test unless they have COVID symptoms.</li> </ul>
5 children or staff in a class test positive within 10 days.	<ul> <li>There have been 5 cases of COVID within the same class within 10 days which could mean that COVID is spreading within that group of children.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>As above for each positive case.</li> <li>The school will discuss the outbreak with Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Public Health and agree strengthening protective measure for 10 school days. Including:</li> <li>Re-introducing staff face coverings for corridor and communal areas.</li> <li>Adapting, limiting or postponing indoor events, trips, open days and performances.</li> <li>Reducing the amount of classes staff work across.</li> <li>Affected class to eat in their classroom and play as a bubble for break/lunch time.</li> </ul>



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		<ul> <li>Resuming twice weekly staff lateral flow testing beyond September</li> <li>Limiting all non-essential visitors to school.</li> </ul>
COVID cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period.	<ul> <li>Despite the measures indicated above, COVID cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that COVID is spreading widely throughout the school.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Incident management Team meeting held between the school and Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Public Health to agree further measures, for a further 10 school days, including:         <ul> <li>Re-introducing class bubbles.</li> <li>Postponing all non-essential events.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

The school will inform parents of any changes to COVID measures should these be needed.
