## The new Perimeter fencing and gates

We have had several parents comment that they now don't have time to chat and catch up with other parents on the playground. We would therefore like to trial a regular opportunity for a coffee and catch up. This will be the first Friday of every half term from 8.50am – 9.30am. Tea and coffee will be available but we will be asking for a donation of 50p per person towards the

supply of this. We anticipate that this will be self run by parents for parents and we hope you will find this time valuable.

## Fair-trade Fortnight

During the first week back to school after half term, we will be focussing on Fairtrade to coincide with Fairtrade fortnight. During this week the children will learn abut the importance of Fairtrade and how the lives of producers have been changed by this. If you are happy to donate any food which is Fairtrade we would be delighted to receive it. We will be using it as a display and as a teaching point and will then donate it to the homeless housing at Coneygear Court.



On Friday 28<sup>th</sup> February we will be selling Fairfrade bakes (cupcakes/biscuits) to the children as a tuck shop – they will learn what ingredients have been used and where in the world these have come from. ## E-Safety



This week we have spent some time thinking about being safe online as Tuesday was UK Safer Internet Day. We are aware that there are a huge number of benefits to being online and a world of learning opportunities are available to children. However, we are also aware that there are many dangers online too. As a result, there are many, many sources of support for parents to help them to support their children with navigating this. We know how challenging this is as technology moves so fast and children are often more tech savvy than we are!! However, there are some particularly good sources of support:

One App that we are aware is being used by some of our older children is **TikTok**. TikTok is a social networking app which gives users the ability to watch and create short video clips of up to 60 seconds. With 1 billion active users across 155 countries, it seeks to promote safety and has recently released a range of safety videos to promote its safety tools. They can be found by clicking here

Lastly, if your child has a mobile phone, the NSPCC has teamed up with O2 and you can take it along to any O2 shop and they will help you to set up parental controls free of charge even if you don't shop or have a contract with O2!

## World Book day

As you are aware, we will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March. The theme this year is about sharing stories and the social aspect of sharing books. We are therefore asking children to come to school in their pyjamas as during the day, we will have a big 'bed time story' themed read together!

#### Governors roundup

As you are aware, our Governors play a vital role in our school with three main functions: Setting the school a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction; Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils and overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

In order for parents to gain an insight into the sorts of things that the Governors do in order to fulfil their role, we would like to share a 'Governor Roundup' of all that they have achieved each half term. We hope this is useful to you and please do ask if you have any questions!

Over the last half term Governors have:

- Undertaken in school monitoring linked to the curriculum including a visit to maths lessons, meeting with the maths lead and attending a maths parent workshop. We have also monitored Religious Education which included talking to the RE lead and looking at curriculum maps and children's RE books.
- Undertaken a Health and safety walk around and a cleaning inspection. This includes checking some of the schools records such as those relating to fire drills and risk assessments for school activities.
- Completed a Safeguarding audit from the Local Authority which included checking that our records about staff, volunteers and external providers such as sports coaches are accurate and up to date.
- We have monitored our Christian distinctiveness through observing Collective Worship and talking to children about their views on Collective Worship.
- We have ratified many school policies relating to employment and the curriculum.
- We have monitored and analysed our financial provision as we near the end of the financial year. This has involved benchmarking our school against other similar schools in key areas of spend such as staffing. We have also begun to look at our finances for the next financial year, ahead of setting our budget for 2020/2021.

## Update from Government about the Coronavirus

As a public body, we have been asked to share the following with our parent community:

The government is monitoring Coronavirus and taking action at home and abroad. The risk to individuals remains low. Please read the current guidance below.

Advice to those who have travelled recently

Public Health England has changed the advice for individuals who have travelled recently as follows:

#### Travellers from Wuhan and Hubei Province

If you have travelled from Wuhan or Hubei Province to the UK in the last 14 days you should immediately:

• stay indoors and avoid contact with other people as you would with the flu call NHS 111 to inform them of your recent travel to the area

Please follow this advice even if you do not have symptoms of the virus.

#### Travellers from other parts of China and other specified areas

This advice applies to travellers who have returned to the UK from the following areas:

- Elsewhere in China
- Thailand
- Japan
- Republic of Korea
- Hong Kong
- Taiwan
- Singapore
- Malaysia
- Macau

If you have returned to the UK from any of these areas in the last 14 days and develop symptoms of cough or fever or shortness of breath, you should immediately

- stay indoors and avoid contact with other people as you would with the flu
- call NHS 111 to inform them of your recent travel to the country

## Encouraging good hygiene

As always, if you have symptoms of a cold or flu, then there are measures you can take to stop germs:

- always carry tissues with you and use them to catch your cough or sneeze. Then bin the tissue, and wash your hands, or use a sanitiser gel.
- wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after using public transport. Use a sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.
- avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- avoid close contact with people who are unwell.
