Lent challenge

This week we have started Bishop Stephen's lent challenge which has posed the question: GOD'S CREATION, A GIFT OR A LOAN? The challenge is about the planet, creation and life, and how we act as stewards of God's World.

Viewed from space, the earth is seen as a beautiful blue planet, full of life and diversity. It is a great gift and as people, we are stewards of the planet for all life forms living and inhabiting the earth, on land, in sea and air. It is

undoubtedly under threat in 2020, and there are significant groups who are working tirelessly to make sure we take steps to save the planet from pollution and misuse. Many of these groups are children and young people, who have a voice in so many ways.

The Lent challenge is asking schools and their community to think and reflect about the concept of God's Creation – A gift or a loan?

How do we see the earth in the solar system and universe? Is this something we can take and use or misuse? Or is it something for us be part of and look after? Is it a well wrapped present which we can discard after use? Conversely, is it a present we can thankfully receive and look after, enabling others to also receive and pass on in a good state to the next generation.

Many questions and we don't have all the answers!

Science week

We are linking our science week (which starts on Monday) to the Lent Challenge with the theme of 'Our Diverse Planet'. We will launch our week with a presentation from a science specialist teacher from St Peter's School. He has the most amazing ways to demonstrate biodiversity and adaptation which we hope will amaze the children!



During the week the children will learn about 5 different biomes and undertake a variety of investigations and challenges linked to these. This will involve the children being outside everyday and also visiting the Wild Wood at least once during the week. Please can we ask that **all children** bring a pair of old trousers (track suit bottoms would be best), a pair of wellington boots or old trainers which may get wet and muddy) as well as a warm coat. If these could be in a named plastic bag and kept in school all week we would be grateful.

All children have been given a different animal to research as their home learning this week; if you haven't seen this please ask your child and request a new sheet on Monday if needed. We are hoping that this will give us the information about 100 different animals for our 5 different biomes!!
