Newsletter

You may have noticed that our fortnightly newsletter has become a weekly communication since the start of term. We feel that whilst there is information to share and reminders that are helpful, we will continue with a weekly newsletter. However, as things quieten down, we will send fortnightly again. We appreciate the time that parents take to read the newsletter and hope that it continues to be is useful to you.

Recent announcements

I am sure that many of you will have seen the announcement earlier this week about the need for some new and some tighter restrictions in the effort to stop a further rise in Covid 19 infections. Whilst we are pleased that there is little that has changed which directly impacts on schools, we would like to make some suggestions for further actions which parents could take:

- We would encourage parents to wear a face mask/covering when dropping and collecting children from school. This may be particularly important at pick up when queuing and waiting for your child. We know that wearing a mask will offer further protection to both you and those who you talk to.
- We would like to remind parents to use the 2 metre markers on the paths we know that it is very tempting to gather together to talk but this really should be avoided, particularly without a mask.
- Our thanks to those parents who are keeping their children close to them on the field. Some parents have commented that there seems little point in this as the children are mixing together at school. Whilst this is correct, they are only mixing with children in their own class so it is important to keep them with you when more than one class has been dismissed.

Please do remember that we are all playing our part in keeping our whole school community safe; those who are vulnerable or who have previously been shielding are particularly at risk and we can all support in protecting these people in particular.

Covid information

With this newsletter we have sent 2 documents which have been shared with us by the Local Authority. One is a guidance document, 'What are the Rules on Self Isolation? – a Quick Guide for Parents' which is really useful alongside the guide for parents on school absence, sent last week. The second document is a visual guide on what happens when someone in your household is unwell with Covid19. Again, this is a useful visual aid.

Tapestry

We are delighted with the early feedback from our new Reception parents about Tapestry and the window into the classroom that it offers them. The staff in Van Gogh are nearing the end of their initial assessment of the children on entry to Reception and so over the next few weeks you may notice that there are fewer observations of your child. This is usual so nothing to be concerned about. As you will have seen from the diary dates, we will be offering Van Gogh parents a telephone consultation with Mrs Wilcock on 8th October for you to hear a little more about how your child has settled.
