#### We will remember them

We thought we would share with you how we marked Remembrance Day this year across the school as this is an important learning opportunity for all children.

Some children in Van Gogh developed their own Remembrance Service following the whole school service led virtually by Rev'd Mandy. It included prayers for those that had died and a silence. One child said, 'We need to remember the people who died years ago. We need to be silent. They were precious.' This is incredibly touching given that the child is only 4 years.



Before making their own poppies, Monet class

discussed the meaning and importance of wearing poppies and why we commemorate Remembrance Day. The children spent time in the reflection area which currently has a remembrance theme and they discussed why the poppy was chosen as the symbol of remembrance. We made poppies in class and some children went home that night and made their own poppies to wear on 11th November – our thanks to parents who supported with this. One child made a purple poppy to remember the animals who lost their lives in battle too.

During this week we have shared books with a remembrance theme such as War Game, The Poppy Field and the poem, In Flanders Fields.



On Remembrance Day, the whole school watched a special Remembrance Service delivered by Rev'd Mandy and the whole school observed the 2 minutes silence. Some of our older children were pre-recorded to take part in this service and if you would like to watch the service, it can be found here.

# **Parking**



Please can we request again that cars are **not parked along the road** at pick up or drop off times, unless collecting from an after school club. With the staggered times that we have in place there is always room in the car park so there is no need to park along the road. This includes parking at the entrance of the car park as this is dangerous and limits visibility for parents trying to pull out on to the road. We are so fortunate to have a school car park as many schools don't and as such it is important that we make use of it to limit the impact on local residents. Thank you for your support with this.

#### Childcare Bubbles and Advice for Separated Families

The Government has published <u>guidance</u> for parents on how to form a childcare bubble for children aged 13 or under with friends and family that they do not live with. A childcare bubble is where **one household links with one other household** to provide informal childcare to a child or children aged 13 or under. They can provide the childcare in either or both of the homes from the 2 households. We are aware that some of our children are going home with several other families and as such we ask that this guidance is followed.

The government have also issued <u>a briefing</u> in response to some key questions regarding the impact of the coronavirus outbreak on separated families, maintenance arrangements and access to children.

#### Updated guidance for parents and carers

The Government has also updated their guidance for parents and carers on <u>what they</u> <u>need to know about early years providers, schools and colleges during the coronavirus</u> (COVID-19) <u>outbreak</u>. This update provides information on the national restrictions that came into force on the 5<sup>th</sup> November, the latest advice for clinically extremely vulnerable children and young people and advice on the use of face coverings in education settings.

### Term dates 2021/22

Following the announcement this week of a special four-day Bank Holiday weekend to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022, we have amended our term dates slightly as one of our Professional days fell on this new bank holiday. Please see revised version attached.
