## Medicine in school

We are in the process of reviewing our Administration of Medicines Policy and one significant change is that following advice from the British Medical Association, we are now able to administer non-prescribed, over-the-counter medicines. This is to prevent parents needing to make unnecessary appointments to seek a prescription for an over-the-counter medicine simply so that it can be brought into school.

It remains the case that medicines should only be administered by school staff when this is essential and parents will still need to follow our procedure by filling in a consent form etc.
