We have loved this term!

Once again I have enjoyed taking the time to reflect on just how much we have achieved this term! Staff have introduced a number of new curriculum developments and we are delighted with the positive impact that we have seen. The children have been extremely busy and many of them have commented on the broad curriculum that they are experiencing; they have loved the very in depth design and technology projects as well as opportunities for developing their artistic skills.

In the core subjects we continue to focus on 'reading as writers' so that as we read a text, we recognise what authors are doing in both the content of the writing as well as the structure, and we try to replicate this in our own writing. We are also continuing to develop our writing across the curriculum and giving children opportunities to apply their skills in subjects such as Science and History.

In Maths we have continued our focus on using a range of hands-on material and images to ensure that mathematical concepts are clearly understood before being applied to solving problems. We are also having a big push on ensuring that children know their times tables facts!

The Governors have also been extremely busy this term and their monitoring of the school continues to support us in our drive for continued improvements. The school has once again hosted many visitors who come from other schools to observe good practise here and to learn from what we are doing. I am always so thrilled and proud to share our work with others.

We were very proud of our older children who became school 'tour guides' during our recent open afternoons. Parents commented on how articulate our children are as well as how overwhelmingly positive they are about their time at school.

Once again, my sincere thanks to everyone who has supported us this term, whether by volunteering your time, by sharing resources or by attending events – thank you! The staff team remain resolutely focussed on providing outstanding provision for your children and I am so grateful for their hard work and dedication.
