I am so thrilled that despite all of the ongoing challenges with the current pandemic, our school has remained open and teaching and learning has remained at a consistently high standard for all children. The children have adapted brilliantly to new routines and new ways of working; they have accepted that they must remain in their class groups and have found ingenious ways of communicating with each other. Once a week have been able to come together virtually in a collective worship and it's delightful to see the children waving to each other and saying hello. The money raised really does mean a great deal to us and means we can continue to provide resources and opportunities beyond our school budget.

The challenges of socially distancing from each other hasn't stopped us from continuing to be a very close staff team as this is what gives us the strength to face the challenges within the current climate. #### **Daisies Montessori Nursery School**

The Governors have been working hard over the last 6 months on an exciting new development for our school which I am now delighted to be able share with parents. We have had approval from the Diocese and the local PCC to move to the planning application stage of Daisies Montessori Nursery School relocating from Little Stukeley to our school grounds. A new purpose built eco-building with stunning outdoor space has been designed and will hopefully be located on the grass area next to Van Gogh's outside area. This will



run independently of the school and will remain a privately run nursery although we expect that it will enhance our provision as a school greatly. A planning application is currently underway and if this is successful then we anticipate that the new building will be ready in the Autumn 2021. This is a wonderful opportunity and we will be offering parents and the local village community an opportunity to hear more about these exciting plans early next year.

#### Covid update

With this newsletter we have attached a letter from Dr Liz Robin, the Director of Public Health for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. It contains some important reminders about the current tier 2 restrictions for Cambridgeshire and also some important information about the 5 day Christmas period when the restrictions are slightly different. This has been specifically written for schools so is an important read.

We would also like to remind parents that we do have a responsibility with tracking and tracing contacts of confirmed positive cases until the 21st December. Therefore, it is vital that parents do let us know if their child develops symptoms at any time between the end of school today and the 21st December. Please inform us via the <a href="mailto:office@abbotsripton.cambs.sch.uk">office@abbotsripton.cambs.sch.uk</a> email address. We would also request that if your child does develop symptoms, you visit a test centre rather than requesting a postal test if possible as results are returned much more quickly. Please then inform us of the result of your child's test as soon as you can, again via the office email address above.

If we are informed of a member of school staff or a pupil testing positive, we will follow Public Health advice regarding who to inform and will do this by telephone for anyone who needs to isolate because they have been in contact with the positive case whilst in school.
