

English: Continue with **Our trip to the woods – Recount**. Use headings, sub headings and questions including the 4 Ws *when, who, where and why*. Create sentences to describe sights, sounds and feelings. Use prepositions and adverbs including time adverbials. Write compound sentences using the conjunction *because*.

Last stop on Market Street – Narrative.

Use adjectives to describe sights, sounds and touch using adjectives. Use precise nouns, action verbs and time adverbials. Use simile, alliteration and repetition for effect. Explore inner thoughts, feelings and speech to add detail for the reader. Word work to include changes to words – contractions in speech and adding prefixes to root words to change the meaning.

Please continue to support with learning tricky words for reading and spelling.
