School funding



As I'm sure you are aware, Cambridgeshire remains one of the lowest funded local authorities for school funding per pupil.

Cambridgeshire Schools receive £400 less per child than the average funded local authority. For a school of our size, £400 more per pupil would amount to £40,000 more funding, £10,000 per class! networks. The petition only has a short time to run so if you are going to sign, please do so promptly.
